On Pg. 35, Hilmar Gudmundsson, Professor of Glaciology, has provided the world's first quantifiable evidence that an increased amount of Antarctica's ice is flowing into the ocean due to the thinning of the continents' ice shelves whilst on Pg. 37 we explore how Northumbria has dramatically reduced its carbon emissions, surpassing ambitious targets in the last four years, to bring it closer to its carbon neutral goal.
