Northumbria University will welcome the world in 2015 after celebrating the news that Rugby Union is coming home.

The University supported the bid to secure three prestigious Rugby World Cup 2015 fixtures for Tyneside.

Plans are in place to ensure Northumbria is at the heart of what promises to be one of the biggest sporting events the region has ever seen.

"Joining NewcastleGateshead Initiative to mark Newcastle's success in

achieving host city status for the Rugby World Cup 2015 was a proud moment for Northumbria University," said Lucy Winskell, Pro Vice-Chancellor - Business and Engagement at Northumbria University.

"We have a Rugby Union team that competes at the highest level of student rugby and enjoys a great relationship with the Newcastle Falcons and the Northumberland Rugby Union.

"With our very own £30m Sport Central arena on campus, Northumbria University is gearing up to celebrate 2015 with a wide range of world-class sporting opportunities for our students, staff and partners to enjoy."
